Playwright/Director

Edward Bond has written over fifty plays and has written for film, TV and opera as well as poetry. La Comedie-Francaise described his extensive body of theoretical work on drama as the most important since Brecht. He is credited with creating a revolutionary form of committed theatre to succeed Brecht and Stanislavski. His work is controversial, sometimes denigrated, but increasingly described (as in the words of Dublin's landmark Abbey Theatre) as the most influential English dramatist of all times.
