

LARRY KRAMER

Larry Kramer is an author, activist and playwright who famously gave voice to the outrage and grief that inspired a generation of gay men and lesbians to fight for their lives. He cofounded Gay Men's Health Crisis and ACT UP (AIDS Coalition to Unleash Power), his calls for direct action protest making AIDS a national issue and forever changing public health policy. Born in Bridgeport, Connecticut, he grew up in Washington D.C, lived in London for ten years, and now lives in New York City. A graduate of Yale, he has recently been awarded an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters. In 2015, HBO released a documentary about Larry's political activism called LARRY KRAMER: IN LOVE AND ANGER, which was officially selected for the 2015 Sundance Film Festival.
